Overview by The National Gallery:

The Roman soldiers who have been posted to guard Christ's tomb from grave robbers have fallen asleep. Christ has risen from his grave and is shown above his tomb holding a white flag with a red cross, a symbol of the Resurrection. The lid of the tomb is still closed, emphasizing the miracle of the Resurrection – something that the soldiers couldn't have been prepared for even if they had been awake. Christ wears a white and gold robe, which would have shimmered in the candlelight against the gold background, reflecting the heavenly nature of the event.

This panel comes from a four-tiered altarpiece made for the church of San Pier Maggiore in Florence. It belongs to a sequence of narrative scenes showing events from Christ's birth, Resurrection and Ascension. They were situated above the panels of the main tier, which show the coronation of the Virgin surrounded by adoring saints.
